15. C.S. Lewis (1898–1963), born Clive Staples Lewis

Principle: C.S. Lewis, a British scholar and Christian apologist, taught that faith and reason are not adversaries but allies, guiding us to live with purpose and integrity. His writings emphasize that our moral choices and deepest longings reflect a universal order illuminating the path to a life of meaning and service.

Relevance: Lewis's vision of a reasoned faith aligns with the Church of Faith and Reason's mission to harmonize spiritual and scientific understanding. His teachings encourage us to see our actions as meaningful within the pixelated universe—a grid-like reality where every choice resonates, urging us to live authentically and contribute to a world of hope and unity.



16. Leonhard Euler (1707-1783)

Principle: Leonhard Euler, a Swiss mathematician, introduced the number e e e, the base of natural logarithms, defining it as the limit of (1 + 1/n)^n as n approaches infinity, a discovery that revealed the foundation of exponential growth and decay. Through his work in the 18th century, Euler derived e≈2.71828 by studying compound interest and infinite series, a constant now universally accepted by the scientific community as the key to understanding natural processes like population growth, radioactive decay, and the universe's exponential expansion phases.


Relevance: Euler's discovery of e offers a lens to understand the pixelated universe, where the grid's fixed rules drive exponential growth—mirroring the universe's expansion since the Big Bang. His legacy inspires us to approach life's complexities with disciplined reasoning, finding purpose in the mathematical beauty that shapes our reality at the Church of Faith and Reason.

Moment of Reason

100% interest on \$1 paid once a year = \$1+ \$1 =

100% interest on \$1 paid twice a year = \$1 + \$.50 +.75 = \$2.25

100% interest on \$1 paid monthly = \$1 + (~0.135x12)=

100% interest on \$1 paid continuous =

\$2.71828
















Article of Faith 5. Pixelated Motionless Reality
